

Mat 18:14 Thus your Father in heaven does not want even one of these little ones to be lost.

Mat 18:15 "Moreover, if your brother commits a sin against you, go and show him his fault —

but privately, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother.

Mat 18:16 If he doesn't listen, take one or two others with you so that every accusation can be supported by the testimony of two or three witnesses.

Mat 18:17 If he refuses to hear them, tell the congregation; and if he refuses to listen even to the congregation, treat him as you would a pagan or a tax-collector.

Mat 18:35 This is how my heavenly Father will treat you, unless you each forgive your brother from your hearts."

Luk 17:3 Watch yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him.

Luk 17:4 Also, if seven times in one day he sins against you, and seven times he comes to you and says, 'I repent,' you are to forgive him."

Rom 14:10 You then, why do you pass judgment on your brother? Or why do you look down on your brother? For all of us will stand before God's judgment seat;

Rom 14:11 since it is written in the Tanakh, "As I live, says Adonai, every knee will bend before me, and every tongue will publicly acknowledge God."

Rom 14:12 So then, every one of us will have to give an account of himself to God.

Rom 14:13 Therefore, **let's stop passing judgment on each other! Instead, make this one judgment — not to put a stumbling block or a snare in a brother's way**

1Ti 5:17 The leaders who lead well should be considered worthy of double honor, especially those working hard at communicating the Word and at teaching.

1Ti 5:18 For the Tanakh says, "You are not to muzzle an ox when it is treading out the grain," in other words, "The worker deserves his wages."

1Ti 5:19 **Never listen to any accusation against a leader unless it is supported by two or three witnesses.**

Gal 6:1

Brothers, if someone is caught in a sin, you who are spiritual should restore him gently. But watch yourself, or you also may be tempted.

Matthew 6:15

But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.

1 John 2:10-12

10 Anyone who loves their brother and sister[a] lives in the light, and there is nothing in them to make them stumble. 11 But anyone who hates a brother or sister is in the darkness and walks

around in the darkness. They do not know where they are going, because the darkness has blinded them.

1 Timothy 5:19

Do not entertain an accusation against an elder unless it is brought by two or three witnesses

Deuteronomy 19:15-17

One witness is not enough to convict anyone accused of any crime or offense they may have committed. A matter must be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses. If a malicious witness takes the stand to accuse someone of a crime, the two people involved in the dispute must stand in the presence of the LORD before the priests and the judges who are in office at the time.
